# Pastor's Ponderings

I was reading something recently which referred to an Apostolic Exhortation, C'est la confiance, which Pope Francis wrote to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of St. Thérèse of Lisieux. It is interesting to note that Thérèse died at the age of 24 in 1897 in a contemplative convent in France and yet her writings on the spiritual life have been regarded as offering key insights into the spiritual life. Thérèse has also been declared a Patron of the Missions and a Doctor of the Church. In the short letter, Pope Francis says some interesting things which are particularly relevant when there is so much anxiety in our world. In our lives, we are often "assailed by fears, the desire for human security, the need to have everything under control " (23). The trust and therefore the abandonment in God that Thérèse promotes "sets us free from obsessive calculations, constant worry about the future and fears that take away our peace." "If we are in the hands of a Father who loves us without limits," quoting St. Therese, Pope Francis tells us, "this will be the case come what may; we will be able to move beyond whatever may happen to us and, in one way or another, his plan of love and fullness will come to fulfilment in our lives" (24). A key point which Pope Francis makes is that we evangelise, we bring others toward God by "attraction and not by pressure". How we live our lives can bring others toward God. Thérèse testifies to the radicalism of the Gospel. So living the Gospel is once again fundamentally about love and the absolute primacy of love. Don't be disheartened. Have faith. Believe in the power of love. And know that our world changes when each of us lives a life of love. It makes sense. It even works! (Fr. George Hayes)
