

Pastor's Ponderings

On Sunday, Pope Francis celebrates his 87th birthday so we pray health and happiness on our Holy Father and on his life and ministry. I was listening to something on the radio a while ago and it referred to some secrets for happiness in life. The speaker was a medical doctor and he alluded to several keys to happiness – one of the things he encouraged was talking to strangers. In psychological studies that have been undertaken, throughout the world, it has been shown that talking to a stranger is good for the person who initiates the conversation and good for the recipient. There was a feel-good factor afterwards for the two parties. The interaction, even with a stranger, reminds us that we are inherently social beings. So as Advent comes to a conclusion, and as Christmas approaches, maybe we should try it – it's fairly easy for those who are extroverts, a bit more difficult for introverts. But why not speak to the person in the café or speak to the person serving the coffee or exchange a few words with a person on a train or a bus or in a gueue, maybe even in Church! We are inherently social beings and no amount of talking on the phone or scrolling through social media or virtual meetings can ever replace the human word and the moment of human interaction. Talk to a stranger. Try it in the week ahead. As they say, spread a little happiness!
