Pastor's Ponderings

I was reading an article, the other day, which quoted the Colombian Nobel Prize winning novelist Gabriel Garcia Marquez. In his fictional novel, A hundred years of solitude, Garcia Marquez wrote of the "peaceful charms of old age" and suggested that "the secret of a good old age is simply an honourable pact with solitude". It made me think about solitude and how valuable it can be. Even when we are in a close relationship, we can have times of solitude – times when we are completely content and at ease on our own. There is, of course, a difference between solitude and loneliness. Loneliness is an absence that can feel sharp and cold, an ache which cannot be easily filled. Solitude, by contrast, is an ease with oneself, an ease with one's company, an inner kind of happiness. In a world where we can converse with people at the other end of the globe on a mobile phone and in a culture where there is so much instant access to each other with texts, social media posts and blogging, isn't it somewhat ironic that people can still feel lonely? Loneliness is not only a phenomenon of the elderly apparently, guite a lot of young people experience loneliness. It seems to me that we have to cultivate solitude. We have to nurture an ability to be at ease in our own skins. We have to be able to sit into ourselves, as it were. We have to be at ease with Kenmare Adult Education Centre course: smartphones for ourselves and not constantly seek diversion, noise, stimulation. I've have many opportunities while, on retreat, over fetchcourses, je or call 086 8279248. the years. So, in the week ahead, let's take out the earphones, even for a while. Maybe switch off the mobile phone or put it on silent. Turn off all the background noise. And let's sit quietly with ourselves. And discover hidden depths. And be content with who God causes us to be. It is the route to a contented solitude. (Fr. George Haves)
