

## Pastor's Ponderings

In this month of November, we are encouraged to reflect on the reality of death and what it means in our lives. Many people dislike thinking of death and avoid even mentioning the word. But surely reflecting on death can truly enable us to live life and be more conscious of making the most of life. After all, almost like nature, if there is no autumn and winter in life, how can there be a spring and a summer? So often, in life, we seem to need contrasts to help us - when there is a drought we can appreciate the value of rain, when there is restlessness we can appreciate the value of sleep, when we become sick we really appreciate health. I was reading something during the week and it guoted the author Rose Tremain who says "the secret of a successful life is not to die before one's death". That is a challenging sentence. Are we embracing all the opportunities we are given by God for living life to the full? I think of people who have been some of the most important influences in my life. Invariably, these people had a capacity to be positive, to see the good, to deal with the struggles and challenges which life brings. They certainly encouraged me to live life to the full. As one of those people used say "we are here to live, not to exist". So, funnily and rather paradoxically, reflecting on death, and reflecting on the lives of those who went before us, enables us to be people of vitality, of energy and of life. Let's not allow ourselves to die before our death. Let's use the time we have been given to move forward with hope. Never underestimate the influence for good you can be today. 
