Pastor's Ponderings

Normally, I'm reading several books at the same time. Recently, I was reading about the great tennis player, Rafael Nadal. He is regarded as one of the greatest players in the modern era, who announced his retirement just a few weeks ago. Nadal is a magnificent athlete and competitor. And he has a great personality - whenever he was interviewed after a match, he was engaging, charming and sporting, whether he won or lost the match. But one of the things which I found interesting is that Rafael Nadal, the incredible athlete and competitor, is supposedly afraid of the dark. Could one ever imagine that such a powerhouse of energy, determination and resilience would be afraid of the dark? We can never know what fears each of us can have, hidden from the public, unknown to most people. I am also reading Johnny Sexton's book, Obsessed, on his career as one of Ireland's greatest rugby players. I knew Johnny's grandparents, John and Brenda Sexton, who lived in Listowel, where Johnny's father was born and grew up. In fact, Brenda, Johnny's grandmother, died during the past eighteen months, well into her 90's. Anyway, Johnny writes in the book of going to school in St. Mary's in Rathmines, where the students went to mass regularly. One of the traditions he always kept up, was going to mass before a major game. When the squad had a home game in Lansdowne Road, and the team was based in the Shelbourne Hotel, Johnny would guietly leave the hotel and head over to the Carmelite Church on Clarendon Street to attend mass. Again, in the context of contemporary culture in Ireland, I found that interesting - that one of the great sporting icons of our time would take time out to attend mass, where he found peace and nourishment. Isn't it funny how we can see the hardnosed competitor side of these sporting greats and, yet, there is another side which is often quite vulnerable. The literary adage "You should never judge a book by its cover" seems apt. Beneath all our surfaces, we are complex people with strengths and insecurities, talents and foibles. Sometimes, we have to be patient and dig deeper.
