Pastor's Ponderings

It's funny how we use language in Ireland. It has a wonderful richness. And, of course, there is a great originality in what is known as Hiberno-English – the English which we use in Ireland which has been influenced by our own native language of Irish. I was going into the supermarket the other day and overheard two men greet each other. One said to the other" And you are still above ground....it really is a great greeting and says so much. It could be an expression of happiness that the person is still alive. It could be delight in meeting the other person. It could have left something unsaid. I thought if you met an English person and used that phrase they wouldn't have a clue what you meant. In the week ahead, we celebrate Catholic Schools Week, where we celebrate all that is good in Catholic education. I am immensely grateful to the educators I have had over the years. So many of them were passionate about imparting knowledge and handing on their learning, and perhaps, more importantly, their passion. I always remember with fondness, my first teacher, whom I encountered, in my local two-teacher primary school, outside Listowel. Ms. Stack was coming to the end of her teaching career by the time I arrived. She had taught all nine of my brothers and sisters. She was a woman of kindness, faith and goodness, who exposed us children to the wonders of the world, the beauty of language and the importance of love. Ms. Stack taught me for four years. And along, with my parents, Ms. Stack was a very big influence on me. So this week, let's be grateful for all the people who have been such positive influences on our lives as teachers and educators. Teaching is a noble vocation. It provides the opportunity to form the minds and characters of future generations. May all our Catholic schools be blessed. And be thankful that "you are still above ground"
