Pastor's Ponderings

I watched, with excitement and joy, as Pope Leo appeared on the famous balcony of St.Peter's basilica ten days ago. His first words were those of the Risen Christ to the disciples "Peace be with you". And then, in his opening address, Pope Leo spoke of the importance of peace and how vital it is to build bridges in life's relationships. And those words got me thinking. In a Whatsapp group, of which I am a part, someone had posted a comment, after Christmas, which had really annoyed me. I was angry and upset with one of my friends and decided that I'd withdraw from posting on the group. The other three members of the group encouraged me to return but I was holding fast to my grudge - no giving in until I got an apology and an indication of regret from the one who had put up the offending post. I was resolute and wasn't prepared to give in. And then I heard Pope Leo challenge us to build bridges and be people of peace. I needed to let go of something which was, actually, quite simple and inconsequential. I needed to let go of my grudge. And so I, metaphorically, threw it into the river and pilgrims who travel. let it go. And I've felt better. And all is rosy in the Whatsapp group again and we are all communicating. It's amazing the effect Pope Leo's words had on me. The wounds have been repaired. The bridges have been restored. And the moral for me, is that it is better to build bridges than let old wounds fester!
