Pastor's Ponderings

One of the most famous lines from the Confessions of St. Augustine is "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you". St. Augustine, 354 -430, was a right *hairo* as we say in Hiberno-English, to describe someone who led a completely reckless and hedonistic life, dedicated only to escapism, pleasure and enjoyment. His mother, St. Monica, prayed all her life that Augustine would turn his life around - and then, Augustine had a complete conversion of heart and was baptised in 386 at the age of 31. Following this turnabout, St. Augustine went on to be one of the greatest writers on the spiritual life and profoundly influenced the development of Christianity in the West. Augustine's account of his life and conversion, known as the Confessions, has become one of the great texts of the Christian tradition. In the Confessions, Augustine details how he searched for happiness in all sorts of places but it was only, in God, that he found true happiness. It is interesting how Pope Leo, our new Pope, is a member of the Augustinians, the Order founded on the life and writings of St. Augustine. It will be interesting to see how the thought of one of the greatest minds in Western thought, St. Augustine, will influence the future writings of Pope Leo. Wouldn't it be interesting to organise a talk, here in Kenmare, on St. Augustine and see how his writings can be applied to our search for happiness in our most modern of lives in 2025?
