Today's Gospel ~ What is 'humility'?

Some think being humble means we can't acknowledge the good we do. They might go so far as to think being humble means thinking they are not good. That's not true. We can be humble and acknowledge the good we do by giving credit where credit is done. This begins with acknowledging that the Lord is 'the giver of every good gift' (opening prayer for Mass today). We are able to do good because of the gifts God has given us. Jesus teaches about humility in the context of places of honour at a wedding banquet. Humility is a virtue that we need to make part of our whole life. Isn't it easier to work with someone who humbles themselves and will work with you rather than work with someone who will do anything to get ahead without concern for others? In proper humility we open ourselves to the help of others. We open ourselves to God's guidance. Here I think of Sirach's words, 'the mind of a sage appreciates proverbs and an attentive ear is the joy of the wise.' If we are truly humble and wise, we want to listen so that we may grow. After all, what is our goal? Are we looking to make a lot of money (that would be greed)? Do we just want to look good (that would be pride)? Or are we trying to live the words of the Lord's Prayer, 'your kingdom come,' working to make God's kingdom known in this world? (Fr Jeff, Intercom)
